

From April 7 to April 9, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1251 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

Supporters of the bill say it would limit the influence of big money in politics by empowering small donors; make voting easier and more secure; end gerrymandering through independent redistricting commissions; and give the public more information about who is lobbying Congress.

Opponents say it would be an overreach by the federal government and is a partisan powergrab.

[2] The For The People Act establishes a small donor matching program. Under the program, Congressional candidates who reject money from PACs and big donors are eligible to have small donations under \$200 matched at a rate of 6-to-1. A \$10 donation, for example, would be matched with \$60 from the federal fund, giving the candidate \$70 in total.	Strongly support	24%	40%	21%	9
